ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Pearl Cleage (b. December 7, 1948) is an award winning playwright, author, and activist based in Atlanta, Georgia. Much of her work celebrates and honors the experience of black women. Her first novel What Looks Like Crazy on An Ordinary Day landed on Oprah's Book Club list in 1998 and stayed on the New York Times Best Seller List for nine weeks. She has won numerous awards for her work including a Governor's Award for Arts and Humanities and a Bronze Jubilee Award for Literature in 1983.

She was born in Springfield, Massachusetts, but grew up in Detroit where her father was a pastor and activist in the Civil Rights Movement. She attended Howard University and Spelman College and in 1971, graduated with a degree in drama. She later joined the faculty of Spelman as a creative director, playwright in residence, and writer. She is currently the Playwright in Residence at the Alliance Theatre and at the Just Us Theater Company in Atlanta.



CHUCK SMITH*

(Director) is a Resident Director (a.k.a. resident snowbird) here at the Westcoast Black Theatre Troupe. His WBTT credits include Knock Me A Kiss, Ma Rainey's Black Bottom,

The Piano Lesson, The Mountaintop, and The Amen Corner. In Chicago he is an associate member of the American Blues Theater Company, and a member of the Goodman Theatre's Board of Trustees, as well as the Goodman Theatre's Resident Director. His Goodman credits include the world premieres of By the Music of the Spheres, The Gift Horse, and Objects in the Mirror, the Chicago premieres of Pullman Porter Blues, Race, Having Our Say, The Good Negro, Proof, The Story, and By the Way, Meet Vera Stark. He directed James Baldwin's The Amen Corner, which transferred to Boston's Huntington Theatre Company, where it won the Independent Reviewers of New England (IRNE) Award for Best Direction. He also directed A Raisin in the Sun, Blues for an Alabama Sky, August Wilson's Gem of the Ocean, Two Trains Running and Ma Rainey's Black Bottom, the 1993 to 1995 productions of A Christmas Carol. Ain't Misbehavin', Crumbs From the Table of Joy, Vivisections from a Blown Mind, and The Meeting. He served as dramaturge for Goodman's 2003 world premiere production of August Wilson's Gem of the Ocean. He directed the New York premiere of Knock Me a Kiss, receiving ADELCO awards for production and direction, and The Hooch for the New Federal Theatre. Regional credits include the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Seattle Repertory Theatre, Nashville Shakespeare Festival, Milwaukee Repertory Theater, Alabama Shakespeare Festival, the Ensemble Theatre in Houston, the Robey Theatre Company in Los Angeles, the University of Illinois in Champaign, University of Wisconsin in Madison, and Fisk University in Nashville. At Columbia College Chicago he was facilitator of the Theodore Ward Prize playwriting contest for 20 years and editor of the contest anthologies Seven Black Plays and Best Black Plays. He won a Chicago Emmy Award as associate

producer/theatrical director for the NBC teleplay Crime of Innocence and was theatrical director for the Emmy winning Fast Break to Glory and the Emmynominated The Martin Luther King Suite. He was a founding member of the Chicago Theatre Company, where he served as artistic director for four seasons and directed the Jeff-nominated Suspenders and the Jeff winning musical Po'. Other Chicago area credits include the Victory Gardens Theater, Roosevelt University, DePaul University, Eclipse Theatre, ETA, Black Ensemble Theater, Northlight Theatre, MPAACT, Congo Square Theatre Company, The New Regal Theater, Kuumba Theatre Company, Fleetwood-Jourdain Theatre, Pegasus Players, and the Timber Lake Playhouse. He is the proud recipient of the 1982 Paul Robeson Award and the 1997 Award of Merit presented by the Black Theater Alliance of Chicago. He is a 2003 inductee into the Chicago State University Gwendolyn Brooks Center's Literary Hall of Fame, and a 2001 Chicago Tribune Chicagoan of the Year. He has received lifetime achievement awards from The League of Chicago Theaters and the Joseph Jefferson Awards Committee. In 2019 he received an Honorary Ph.D. from his alma mater Governors State University.



TRAVIS RAY* (Assistant Director) earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Theatre Performance from Alabama State University. He continued his professional actor training at the Johnny Carson School of Theatre

and Film and also holds a Master of Fine Arts degree in Theatre Management/ Arts Administration from The University of Alabama. Travis has worked for the Alliance Theatre, Atlanta Coalition of Performing Arts, the King Tut Exhibit, Children's Theatre of Charlotte, the Goodman Theatre, Steppenwolf Theatre Company, and Tyler Perry Studios.
